Christian identity

1 Peter 2:4-10

The letter so far...

This semester we are reading 1 Peter – a letter from the apostle Peter, to Christians scattered throughout Asia Minor in the mid-60s AD. Peter describes Christians as “exiles” or “foreigners” in the world, who endure suffering now but look forward to a glorious future inheritance in heaven. Peter writes to encourage them (and us) to stand firm in God’s grace during our temporary stay in this world (5:12). So far we’ve read about the privileges of salvation, and what it means to belong to God’s family. This week, Peter uses some images from the Old Testament to explain more about the identity and purpose of Jesus and his people...

Holy: *Set apart for a special purpose; totally pure.*

Priesthood: *In the Old Testament, priests were dedicated to God’s service. Their role was to act as a mediator between God and people (telling people God’s word, praying to God for people, offering sacrifices to God for people).*

Cornerstone: *The first and most important stone laid in the foundation of a building.*

How does Peter describe Christian believers? What does this mean?

How do you think these verses would encourage Christians experiencing suffering or persecution?

What do we learn about the **identity** and **purpose** of God’s people?
