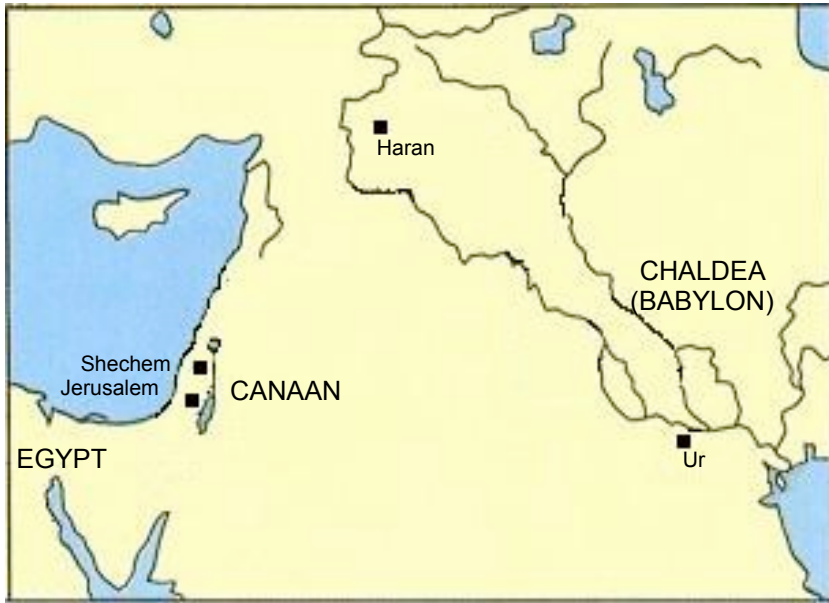


Read God's Word
