## Getting to know one another...

### The story so far

In the Old Testament times before Jesus, God's people were looking forward to a time called "the Kingdom of God". This would be a time when everything would be perfect, when evil would be destroyed, and when God would live with His people forever.

Even before Jesus was born angels said that he was born to be King. As an adult, Jesus gathered a group of disciples who followed him, listened to his teaching, and saw his miracles. After experiencing all these things they concluded that Jesus truly is God's chosen King (Luke 9:20).

Now Jesus is heading to Jerusalem—the capital city, the city of the kings. As Jesus travels along the road he has much to teach us about the Kingdom of God.

### 1. The Kingdom of God is coming

Read Luke 17:20–21.

### 2. The Kingdom of God will come fully

Read Luke 17:22–37.

Jesus is now speaking to his disciples. The Kingdom of God is very close now, because King Jesus has come. In this passage he talks a lot about a time called 'the day of the Son of Man'. That will be the time when Jesus comes back in the future, and the Kingdom of God will be a reality.
