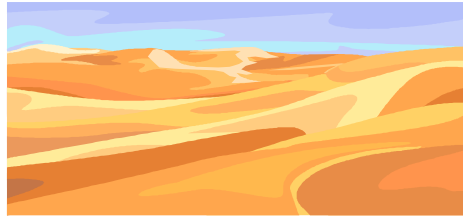


What connections can you think of between Deuteronomy and our passage tonight?
