BIBLE STUDY STUDY 3 — ABRAHAM AND THE PROMISE

THE STORY SO FAR

Try retelling the story of the OT from studies 1 and 2. What can you remember?

WHAT WE MISSED ALONG THE WAY

Today's study is about God's promises to a man called Abram. But there are many things which happened between Noah and Abram. Here is a brief summary of what we missed along the way.

After the flood subsided, Noah and his family once again filled the world with people. But because they were descended from Adam and Eve, Noah's children and children's children continued to sin. Some tried to build a tower to make a name for themselves but God stopped that plan by confusing their languages. This incident was called the Tower of Babel. Soon after God chose a man called Abram and God gave him a promise that will one day solve the problem of sin.

READ GENESIS 12:1-9.
